I. Administrative and Community Services Committee Report

1. Results of Planning Commission Meeting-April 11, 2019

Doug Partney updated the Council that the Planning Commission held a special hearing as well as their regularly scheduled meeting Thursday. EJ Equipment requested a special use permit to incorporate a paint booth into their current facility. The Current zoning does not allow for this paint booth. The Commission asked many questions at the meetings. All questions were answered and addressed. The

paint booth filters air, is self-contained, and will be inside one of their existing bays. This will not require changing the structure of the building, nor will it require additional venting or draining to outside. It will allow them to service clients for which they currently must subcontract this type of work. The booth will allow them to be more competitive, generate more sales and sales tax, and potentially employ more people. If the ordinance is approved it will go to Building and Zoning for further permits. He added that they are under EPA guidelines and requirements. Partney concluded that the ordinance to be voted on during this meeting comes with the recommendation of the planning commission.

2. Building and Zoning Administrative Coordinators Report Building and Zoning Administrator Linda Taake stated that they will start doing the zoning ordinance. That will encompass a look at zoning classes and other communities.

J. Finance and Economic Development Committee Report

Nathan Henderson stated that the March/April expenses on the aged obligation report total \$847,980.14.

K. Law Enforcement and Emergency Services Committee Report

1. Chief of Police Report

Chief Brad Parsons spoke of the Kyle Deatheradge 5k run last weekend. He commented that it was well supported and attended with approximately 340 runners. He announced that Kyle Deatheradge's motorcycle (bought with seized funds) will be put back into service to be assigned to Officer Lucas. He shared the badge that will be adhered to it.

Chief Parsons went on to remind of IDOT's grant and well-advertised Distracted Driving detail in Troy for 5 hours a day this month. He mentioned three Illinois State Troopers killed this year plus a fatality on Troy O'fallon Road due to distracted driving.

He then reminded everyone that Donna Markovich will be retiring at the end of May. He said they expect her position to be filled within weeks of that event.

L. Public Works Committee Report

1. City Engineer's Report

City Engineer Tom Cissell covered a few topics. He discussed the slope and surveying done at the Liberty Square ramp as well as the 4th phase of Hampton Glen that came in. He also said that Taylor Lake yards have been staked, but that equipment will not be able to work until the ground is dry.

2. Public Works Schedule and Report

Public Works Director Rob Hancock reported that the crew has been disinfecting the tank vault and distribution main portion of water plant.

He expects sampling on that the week after that and hopes the clear well will be in service by the end of April/early May. Grading and fence work is being conducted at the ground storage tank. He mentioned routine work done at the TA (Travel Centers of America) to follow up on a sewer main repair and said he expects some more work to be done on Edwardsville Rd.

He reported an electrical problem at a lift station Saturday Night/Sunday morning during storms. An overcurrent issue caused the installation of a bypass pump.

Troy Turner reminded us that the backflow preventer cards/surveys are mandatory and the whole town is surveyed. The survey happens every two years, and can be done online or contact Aqua Backflow.

3. Resolution 2019-08 – A resolution waving the right of the City of Troy, Illinois to Disapprove the Southwestern Illinois Development Authority's Intent to issue its revenue bonds to finance a project to be located in the City of Troy, Illinois

City Attorney Fred Keck explained the Southwest Illinois Development Act (SWIDA) and its role as an authority to issue money and/or bonds for projects. In this case, Anderson Hospital is seeking to use SWIDA as a bonding mechanism. Because the development is within our jurisdiction, our consent is required to allow them to borrow money. No money is required of us, nor does it negatively impact us. If we should choose to approve this Resolution, we would be allowing them to move forward with the development. A vote in favor will mean that you DO NOT object.
